## Section 1 Introduction

Being inspired by the repertoire (and eventual election) of Her Excellency, Dr. Afrikana Chihombori-Quao, as the African Union's Ambassador to the United States of America and inclined to answer the three question, being posed to all members of the Diaspora: "*Who are you?*", "*Where are you?*" and "*What do you do?*", there grew a need for those of Gambian blood, to step up and answer the call to serve our homeland.

Then after the successful, December 2016 election of His Excellency Adama Barrow, as the President of the Republic of the Gambia, the need for a comprehensive plan of action and sustainability, of constituent-run programs, birthed the need of this dossier; His election and taking office in January 2017, made it right to offer President Barrow help, to move quickly to distinguish his government. The new government promised to make Gambia the "Human Rights Capital of Africa," to release scores of political prisoners, and began to strengthen the judiciary and reform the security services.

His office also reversed the planned withdrawal from the International Criminal Court (ICC).

President Barrow's government has been taking steps to reform the judicial branch, by appointing a slate of new judges, including a respected new Supreme Court head. The government is significantly reducing prison overcrowding by pardoning more than 250 prisoners in February and March 2017. On September 21, of that same year, His Excellency, Adama Barrow signed a UN treaty committing Gambia to abolish the death penalty.

Proposed legislation on the creation of a Human Rights Commission, which was drafted in 2016 with UN assistance, was presented to the National Assembly for adoption in November 2017.

With this in place, on the national level, our proposal of recognition and support of dire programs and needs within the country, has made the local civilians, desire a chance to *really make a difference in the country, right where they live.*

This stance of better living, housing, health and education, at the human rights level, has engaged residents to formulate a commission to dispose communal help, from the duties, jobs and talents they already possess. Ergo, this Intelligentsia has a very prodigious desire to **be** the solution, to the very problems that they live in, in real-time.

This overview seeks the protection and acknowledgement from the US Embassy to the Republic of The Gambia, the African Union and the United Nations, and any other Global Alliance that see the need in truly returning the power back to the people, to help them, *help themselves.*

As written in your Organizational Structure; "*...It is now part of a larger transformation of the UN System that will help enhance the Organization's overall effectiveness in implementing its mandates by aligning responsibilities with authorities and simplifying and decentralizing processes in mandate implementation....*"\*\* we seek to establish that same rate of solutions as imposed by this creed.
